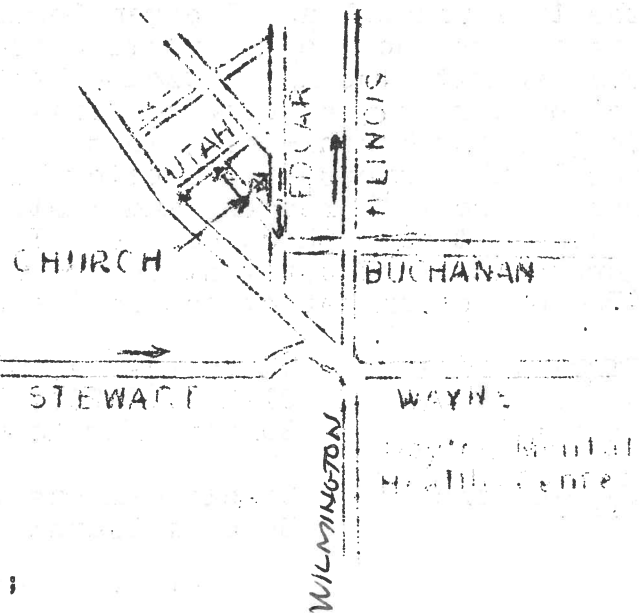

15th ANNUAL TRI-CITY FESTIVAL - COLUMBUS - SATURDAY APRIL 15
1:00 PM to 11:00 PM - FREE FOR MVFD MEMBERS. - One of the best ways to enjoy Folk Dancing is to visit other clubs for the fellowship, learning their dances, and dancing old ones with them. The best opportunity to do this is at the annual Tri-City Festival each spring. The host rotates between Columbus, Cincinnati and Dayton. This year the Whetstone Folk Dancers host the Festival. Each of the six clubs in the tri-city are invited to teach a dance. The MVFD dance to be taught will be "Louie Louie" by Anne Beattie.

The cost would have been \$1.00 for the afternoon teaching session, \$3.50 for a Macedonian dinner, and \$1.50 for the evening party for MVFD members. At the decision of the Council based on past practices, these fees will be paid from the treasure for members. However each person attending from MVFD should inform Sam Ballinger if he does not expect to attend all 3 sessions.

The Festival will be held at the VFW Hall on S. High St. Exit off of I-70 at exit 100A and travel S. on High. (Maps are available) If any one needs a ride, please indicate on the sign up sheet. ALL RESERVATIONS MUST BE IN BY END OF DANCE ON 30 MARCH.
