- Sep 20, Folk Dance Classes If you are interested in more instruction in folk dancing than you get with MVFD, there are a couple of opportunities this fall of which you may want to take advantage. The Yugoslav Club is sponsoring a class on Yugoslav Folk Dancing, to be taught by members of the Zivio dancers; and the Beavercreek Adult School is sponsoring a class on International Folk Dancing, to be taught by Lou Hyll. Sep 24, Field Trip - Forest View Gardens - Note the change of date. You must make reservations with Leslie by Sept. 7. Information sheet for participants will be available Sept. 14. This will be a very good workshop, and will include both partner and non-partner dances. There will be something for everyone. Mark this weekend on your calendars so you won't forget. Thursday Evening Programs - When you are in charge of a Thursday evening of dancing, please be a responsible programmer by providing a balanced program for all of our dancers. A very simple way to do this is to alternate between line dances and couple dances by playing two of each. For example, you might begin your program with 2 easy line dances in which the beginners may participate, continue with 2 mixers for everyone to say hi, then 2 intermediate line dances, 2 set dances, 2 line dances, 2 couple dances, 2 line dances, 2 line dances, 2 line dances, 2 couple dances, 2 line dances, then 2 easy line dances, then 2 couple dances, 2 line dances, etc. Also, don't forget about the request board. Play requests no less than every 3rd or 4th dance. You are not required to go straight down the request list because you may not be able to keep a balanced program that way. If the next dance on the board is a line dance and it is time for a couple dance, skip to the next couple dance on the board and play the line dance when it is time for the next line dance. Leslie would be happy to assist anyone who asks, with more in-depth information about programming of Thursday evenings.
