• Folk Dance Etiquette

- If you are in a line or circle dance and you want to drop out, connect the hands of the people on each side of you so you won't leave a hole in the line. If you aren't sure whether you will be able to keep up with a given dance, join that dance at the end of the line so that you can easily drop out if needed.
- Dropping out of a set or contra dance after it has started is a no-no since doing so will disrupt the dance for others. In general, at least one member of a dancing couple should know the dance well enough to be able to "pull" the other through the dance if necessary. In some cases both dancers need to be familiar with the dance.
- During teaching time it is important for those who are not dancing to keep their conversations down so those being taught can hear the instructor.
