The last newsletter was so full there wasn't enough space to talk about why our Honor Couple was nominated! To remedy that:

Jim and Ellie Woolley actually started out as contra dancers - they met in a contra dance class, and are longtime members of the Dayton Contra Dance Club. They have attended dance camps, workshops, weekends, and conventions as far away as Georgia, and have even been known to do square dancing!

But the Woolleys have been active in MVFD since 1983, so most of us know them as folkdancers. However, they have put an unusual amount of energy into their "active." Jim and Ellie have both served on the Program Committee several times (twice as chair). Jim served as our Treasurer for 10 years. Ellie helped out in the kitchen for years before she became chair of the kitchen committee (4 years and counting).
